



Thoughts for our Sunday School class

Christ and The Promise – Jesus and Fulfillment of Creation

There is hope in the wilderness and while in exile. There is light midst the separation and brokenness of humanity, the ways of death, and struggle for faith (trust).

God's purposes continue to unfold within and midst all creation. The gospel or "Good News" is the center of the story for Christians. The Gospel is the story we share.

According to John 1, Jesus is the Word of God made flesh who dwelt and lived among us. John states that the Word (Greek *Logos* meaning essence, reason, or purpose) was at the beginning of creation. This means that the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus reveal what was present and unfolding within creation. Jesus Christ reveals our dependence on God as the source of life. Jesus' life of humility, service to others, and way of love reveals the reconciliation and fulfillment of all creation to God.

Jesus Christ restores fulfills God's covenant with us and restores our relationship to God. Jesus' establishes a new covenant and reveals the way to life. Jesus is the promise of a new humanity. With our relationship to God restored, living and following the ministry, teachings, and life of Jesus is the revelation of new humanity and new life.

Scriptures to Read:

John 1:14-18 (The Word lived among us)

II Corinthians 5:16-19 (New creation; how we see one another; reconciliation is ours)

Romans 8:35-38 (Nothing can separate us in the Love of God in Christ Jesus)

Ephesians 2:14, 19-22 (Jesus Christ is our peace; there is one household of God)

Questions

What words or phrases stand out to you in the reading of each passage?

What does this passage say to us about experiencing Jesus Christ?

Have you experienced Jesus Christ?

Where does trust in God and life in Christ lead us?

Don't expect one right answer to these questions. These scriptures reveal several insights and answers. The importance of discerning and reflecting on these scriptures is that the discernment of our own unique and individual purpose in life is entwined and related to God's purpose in creation as a whole.



Micronesian Corner



Life in Micronesia

The Federated States of Micronesia, a peaceful and laid back nation, which consists of four separate islands; Chuuk, Yap, Pohnpei and Kosrae — has low crime and tax rates and a steadily increasing tourism industry, making Micronesia a dream location for expats.

Healthcare in Micronesia

Each of the four islands in Micronesia has its own well equipped hospital. The most modern, major hospital can be found on the isle of Pohnpei. Pohnpei State Hospital is an easily accessible health facility, located in the capital city of Palikir. There are also dental services and health clinics throughout the country.

The cost of healthcare can vary between hospitals and clinics; some of these establishments will ask for cash payments or insist on seeing evidence of insurance. For this reason, health insurance is highly recommended before travelling.

Where there is a shortage of medical supplies and equipment, certain urgent cases are referred to the neighboring islands of Hawaii and Guam, where contemporary medical facilities can be found.
